

• Why promote our innovation?


- Contributes to success of other agencies



2023 National Winner City of Walnut Creek

 National Pioneer Award for "Safe Sightings of Signs & Signals"

 Dash-mounted smartphone captures traffic signal sightlines throughout city, correlated to GIS for sight distances

 Reduced city's signal sight clearance procedure from weeks to 1-day!





2024 National Winner City of Moreno Valley

 National Innovative Project Award for "Slow & Safe, Save a Life"

 Custom Speed Cushion design allows emergency vehicles to pass unrestricted without vehicle deflection or slowing

 Design meets city goals of slowing traffic w/o slowing emergency response times






Win for California in 2025!


- Apply online (link below)
